No.102 of 2007</p>	<p>In view of the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court, steps have been taken for setting up Juvenile Justice Secretariat in the Patna High Court.</p> <p>There being need for posting of full time staff and infrastructure for the Secretariat, let the Registrar General work out the details of infrastructure and staff for proper functioning of the Secretariat and accordingly the State Government be requested for necessary sanction of the posts. This is also in terms of the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 5.5.2017 passed in Writ Petition (Criminal) No. 102 of 2007 directing the State Government to render assistance and to cooperate and collaborate with the Juvenile Justice Committee of the High Court.</p>

Regarding perusal of the minutes of meeting of High Level Committee constituted U/S 16 (2)	<p>Perused the minutes.</p> <p>As reported in Agenda No. 2 of the Minutes, State Government be requested to expedite the process of empanelling the Psychiatrists for each district, so that J.J.Bs. are able to comply with the requirement of Section 15 of the Act.</p> <p>Further, with regard to the establishment of Observation Home/Shelter Home/ Places of Safety and separate Observation Homes for girls, State Government be requested to take concrete steps and inform the Committee with regard to progress made and time schedule of their completion.</p> <p>In view of the minutes disclosing that the Observation Home, Sheikhpura has been notified as Place of safety and shall be made functional by the month of October, 2017, it may be communicated to the State Government that remaining works be completed and it be made functional by the 1<sup>st</sup> week of November 2017, after making available the requisite infrastructure.</p>
